There appear to be two **Saint Ethelburga**, one of whom is remembered on 7th July. She was the daughter of King Anna of the East Angles, but longed to live the life of a nun. According to the Venerable Bede there was little opportunity in this country at that time, so she and her niece entered nunneries in Gaul. Ethelburga later became abbess of the monastery of Faremoutier in the Forest of Brie. She began to build a church there, dedicated to all 12 apostles, and was buried in the half-finished church when she died in the year 665.

HYMN OF THE WEEK: *Ye Holy Angels Bright*, sung by Lesley Ann

This hymn was written by Richard Baxter (1615-91), a famous Puritan minister, author, and public figure of his day. *Ye Holy Angels Bright* is a doxology - a poem or hymn that commands an audience to praise God, and is written as though that audience were present and could respond - a poetic form called “apostrophe”.

The “audience” being addressed in the first verse are the angels in heaven - both those who attend God, and those who attend to God’s business on earth, as messengers.

The second verse is addressed to believers who have died and now reside in heaven - the “blessed souls at rest”, released from sin, beholding God’s face, residing in light, abounding in sweet delight.

The third verse shifts from heavenly rest to earthly endeavour, being aimed at believers on earth - the “saints below”, who toil and journey through their earthly lives, in the process receiving both good and ill in this fallen world.

The final verse is addressed to the speaker’s own soul, commanding it to praise God. It echoes the images of the previous verses, pulling the whole hymn together as a celebration of the Communion of Saints.

A reading from the Second Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

2 Cor. 12.2-10

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third

heaven – whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person – whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows – was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Local Community Composting Scheme

Our Church Hall grounds will shortly be playing host to some Community Compost bins, being installed and blessed on 17th July. An event to launch the project will be held in the Hall, (lockdown lifting permitting) on 24th July, 3 - 5 p.m. The scheme, centred in Brighton, already has 40 such sites, where local people sign up to use the bins, and may then use the resulting compost for their own plant pots, window boxes etc. Further details will be made available in due course.

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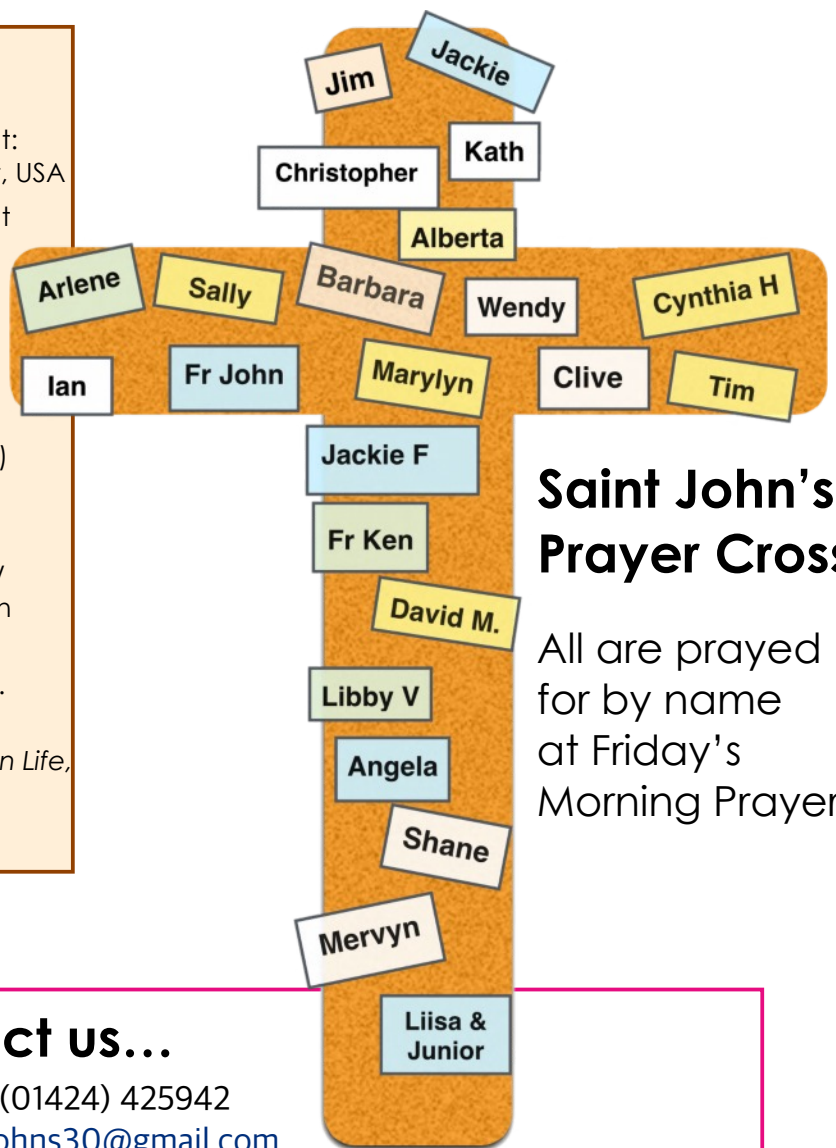
