A reading from Acts of the Apostles

Acts 11.1-18

The apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his

house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'

A Memorial Service for Margaret Ross will be held here at St John's on what would have been her 100th birthday, Wednesday 25th May, at 11:30 a.m.



We are holding an outdoor **Service to Celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee**, on Sunday 5th June at 2 p.m. It will be held in the Church grounds on the Pevensey Road side of the building, by the foundation stone which was laid by the then Princess Elizabeth in 1951. Followed by strawberries & cream and Prosecco in the Rectory garden.

Millions of households in the UK will imminently be pushed into fuel poverty as the higher cost of energy really begins to bite.

So warns CAP (Christians Against Poverty) - *"Now more than ever, people in financial crisis need urgent help."* CAP uses the example of Jayne, a single mum who fell into debt after her Dad died. Jayne tells how her life became an endless cycle of debt, misery and fear.

In desperation, Jayne phoned CAP for help. A few months later, she is on her way to becoming debt-free, and meanwhile she has become a Christian, joined a local church, and has developed money skills for life. As CAP explains, this means that Jayne is now far better prepared to withstand the growing cost of living crisis this Autumn.

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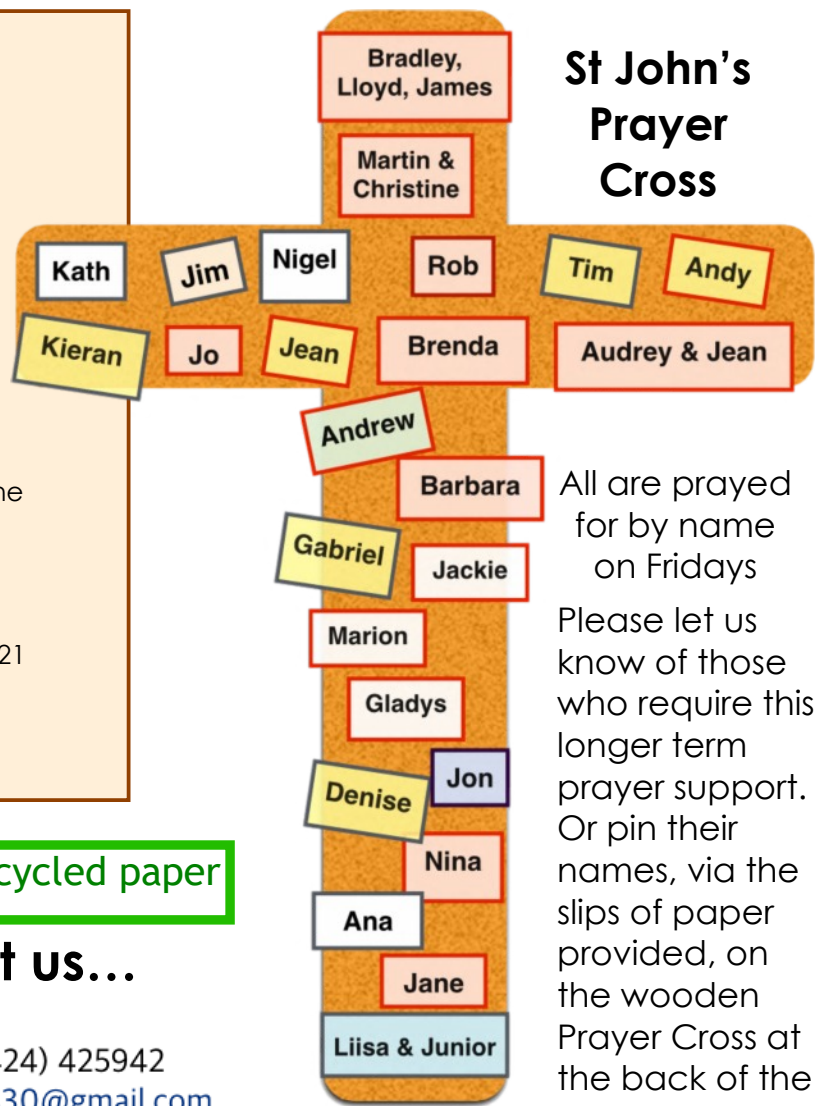
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CAP debt item from *Parish Pump*, June 2022



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
