The Creed

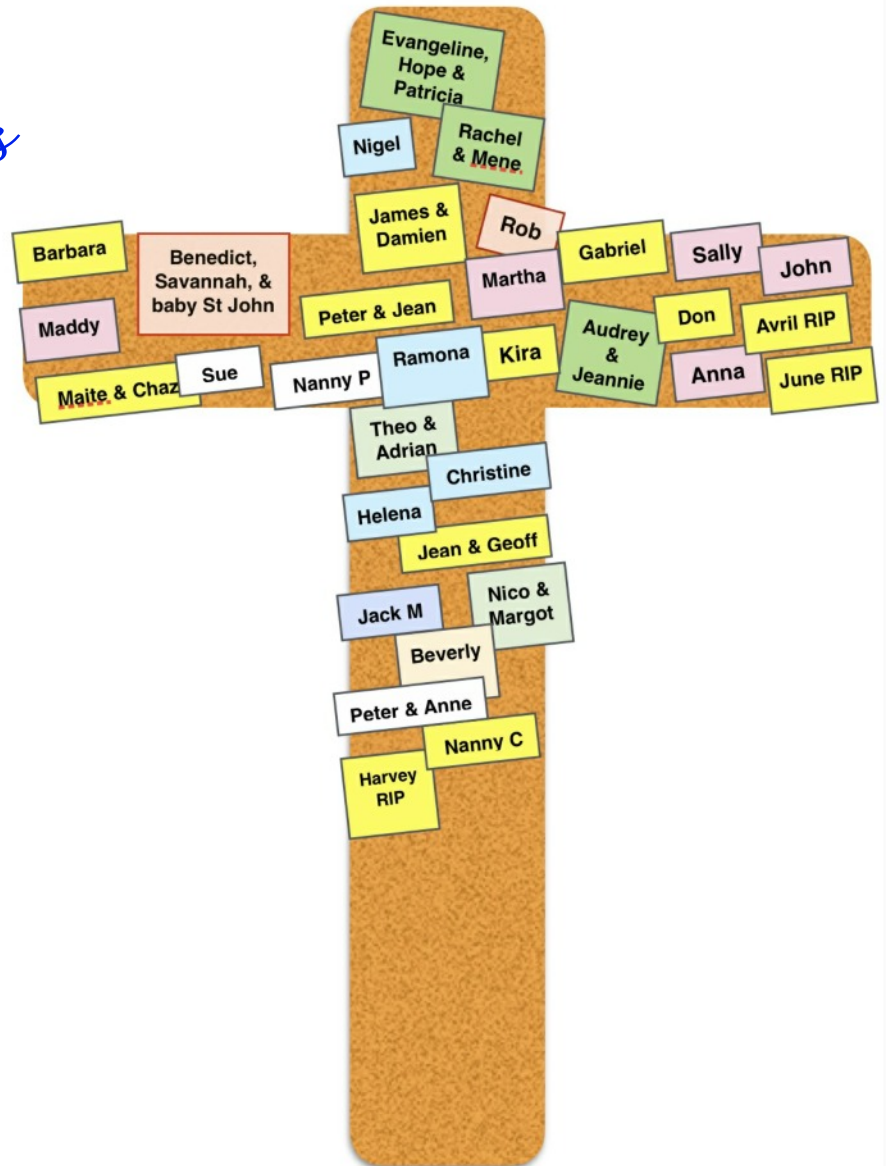
