A reading from the Letter of James

James 3.13-4.3, 7-8a

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield,

full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

Sermon

Renewal of Baptismal Vows

A large candle may be lit.

Priest In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Priest Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? **I reject them.**

Priest Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **I renounce them.**

Priest Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? **I repent of them.**

Priest Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I turn to Christ.

Priest Do you submit to Christ as Lord?
I submit to Christ.

Priest Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

Priest May God, who has given you the desire to follow Christ, give you the strength to continue in the Way.

The Profession of Faith

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;

rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Saint John the Evangelist, Saint Peter, Saint Matthew, Mary the Mother of God, and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Weds 22nd, Fri 24th and Sat 25th are *Ember Days*

Ember Days are three days set apart for fasting, abstinence, and prayer during each of the four seasons of the year. The purpose of their introduction was to thank God for the gifts of nature, to teach people to make use of them in moderation, and to assist the needy.

Ember Days are kept on the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday of the weeks before Petertide (29th June) and Michaelmas (29th September) and also in the week preceding the third Sunday of Advent and the second Sunday of Lent. Ordination ceremonies are often held on Ember Saturdays or the following Sunday. People use the Ember Days to pray for all who are engaged in church ministry and they also pray for vocations in the Church to become manifest.

The term *Ember* may derive from the Anglo-Saxon word *ymbren*, meaning a circuit or revolution, relating to the annual cycle of the year.

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
