As the war in Ukraine continues, here are some ideas from to refresh and renew our prayers for that challenging situation...

Pray using scripture: The Bible can help guide us in prayer – especially in tough situations when it can be difficult to find the right words. Choose one of the following passages of scripture to read through, or pick your own: Matthew 6:6-13; Isaiah 61:1-4; or Luke 6:20-31. Think about the specific needs of the people in Ukraine, those who have fled, and the role of the church in this region.

Pray by baking bread: Bread is often regarded as sacred in Ukrainian culture. Ukraine is an incredibly fertile nation – producing nearly 10 per cent of the world's wheat. Bread and salt placed on an embroidered towel is a symbol of welcome there. As a prayerful act of solidarity with Ukraine, you could bake a loaf of bread, say a prayer over it for Ukrainian families, and then break the bread with your hands (in many Eastern European and Central Asian cultures bread is too sacred to be cut with a knife), then say another prayer for peace in the region.

Pray by lighting a candle: Jesus is the light of the world. Amid the darkness of conflict in Ukraine and around the world, lighting a candle can become a powerful symbol of an eternal truth: love is stronger than hate. Part of prayer is listening out for how God is already at work in Ukraine. You may want to play some sacred music during this time, or read passages from the Bible about God's goodness and mercy.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 65.1-9

The word of the Lord through the prophet: I was ready to be sought out by those who did not ask, to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, 'Here I am, here I am',

to a nation that did not call on my name.

I held out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and offering incense on bricks; who sit inside tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat swine's flesh, with broth of abominable things in their vessels: who say, 'Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you.' These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all day long. See, it is written before me: I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their laps their iniquities and their ancestors'

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Galatians

Gal. 3.23-end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke *All* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Luke 8.26-39

Jesus and his disciples arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, 'What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God?

I beg you, do not torment me' – for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) Jesus then asked him, 'What is your name?' He said, 'Legion'; for many demons had entered him. They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, 'Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.' So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Sermon

The Creed

Last month we looked at the **changing of colours** in the church's vestments and altar cloths during March, April and May this year. This month of June sees them changing again, but this time for around 20 weeks.

We started the month still in the season of Easter; strictly speaking, in the time after the Ascension. The first Sunday in June was the feast of Pentecost. This was and remains a Jewish Festival. At the time of Jesus, it was a joyful celebration of the first


fruits of the Harvest, which was why all the apostles were gathered together in Jerusalem, as was expected of all Jewish men.

As they gathered following Jesus' Ascension, the Holy Spirit came upon them. This is what Christians celebrate at Pentecost, and therefore the colour is red. The following day the colour changed to green [with a quick reversion to white when we celebrated Trinity Sunday, last week] and remains green until 30th October, the Feast of All Saints', which will be white.

This gives us approximately 20 weeks of 'green' with the occasional day in between of white or red to celebrate an apostle, saint or a specific feast day.

This time, that falls outside the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter, is often referred to as 'Ordinary' time, not because it's unimportant or uninteresting, but because the weeks are "numbered". The Latin word *ordinalis* refers to numbers in a series, from which we get our English word *order*. The numbered weeks reflect the ordered life of the Church.

In Church Lectionary terms this period of 'The Xth Sunday after Trinity' follows one main gospel's teachings and miracles of Jesus - this year it's Luke's turn! It's almost as if Jesus gathers us together for a "summer school", takes us up a mountainside and teaches us there. It's a time for learning and growth, as we metaphorically sit on the green green grass, and listen to our Saviour!
