

Sermon

The Creed

The Deacon says :

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. Jesus, true joy of loving hearts,
we turn unfilled to you again.

The priest takes the bread and wine.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here
His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

All glory and honour be yours always
and everywhere,
mighty creator, ever-living God,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
We praise you that on the eighth day
he was circumcised in obedience to the
law of Moses,
that he might fulfil the law and reveal to
us your grace and truth.

For here is foreshadowed
his perfect self-offering upon the cross,
the shedding of his blood to set us free
from sin and death.

In baptism we die with him and are
raised in him,
that we might walk in newness of life,
and proclaim the wonders of his saving
name.

Therefore with all the angels of heaven
we lift our voices to proclaim the glory
of your name
and sing our joyful hymn of praise:

in remembrance of me.

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
