


Welcome to Mass this morning First Sunday of Christmas

All Glory to you, O Lord. Luke 2. 15-21

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child: and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. After eight days had passed, it was time to circumcise the child; and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Sermon

The Creed

Deacon We proclaim the Church's faith in Jesus Christ. All We believe and declare that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is both divine and human. *Dcn* God, of the being of the Father,

the only Son from before time began;

human from the being of his mother, born in the world;

All fully God and fully human; human in both mind and body.

Dcn As God he is equal to the Father,

as human he is less than the Father.

All Although he is both divine and human

he is not two beings but one Christ.

Dcn One, not by turning God into flesh,

but by taking humanity into God; *All* truly one, not by mixing humanity with Godhead, but by being one person.

Dcn For as mind and body form one human being so the one Christ is both divine and human.

All The Word became flesh and lived among us; we have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

(from the Athanasian Creed) **Prayers of Intercession -** led by the intercessor in their own words or...
