The Greeting

Prayer of Confession

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ. who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

The priest says the Absolution

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *All* **Amen.**

A reading from the First Letter of John

1 John 3.16-24

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us – and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John *All* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

John 10.11-18

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away - and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in

order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. *All* **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon

The Creed

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

has conquered the powers of death and hell

and restored in men and women the image of your glory.

He has placed them once more in paradise

and opened to them the gate of life eternal.

And so, in the joy of this Passover, earth and heaven resound with gladness, while angels and archangels and the powers of all creation proclaim for ever the hymn of your glory: All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;

grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it,

in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith: *All* Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross,

his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;

rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,

and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Saint John the Evangelist, Saint Peter, Saint Mark, Mary the Mother of God, and all the saints,

may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. *All* **Amen.**


Concluding Voluntary: Postlude Cantique (Dubois)

History Corner: the fourth St John's



Spot the differences! One is that the architect envisioned the choir and organ

Last time, we left our story with Princess Elizabeth laying the foundation stone for the fourth (current) building. Here are architect Mr Goodhart-Rendel's drawings for the proposed exterior and interior of the new building. We are told that he "had virtually been given carte blanche in the matter of design" and that the new building incorporated many unusual features which were dear to his heart. His conception of the ideal church was "a cheerful, happy place", and the brightness of the whiteglass windows, the light pastel interior colours, and the "snowcrete" walls were designed to create a light cheery interior.



up on the balcony. Despite the positive acoustic effect this did not prove popular with the congregation, who preferred the choir to take part in the liturgical procession, and to be re-sited at ground level. The chapel at the north side of the chancel was also not included in the build.

Give us the knowledge that we may continue to pray with understanding hearts, and show us what each of us can do to set forth the coming of the day of universal Peace. Amen.


First prayer from space, from Apollo 8, 1968.

On Tuesday, 27th, the Church commemorates poet Christina Rossetti (1830-94)

Christina Rossetti was born in London, one of four children of Italian parents. Her father was the poet Gabriele Rossetti; her brother Dante Gabriel Rossetti also became a poet and a painter. Rossetti's first poems were written in 1842 and published by her grandfather. She went on to write some poems under the pseudonym Ellen Alleyne.

Rossetti is best known for her ballads and her mystic religious lyrics, and her poetry is marked by symbolism and intense feeling. She became established as a significant voice in Victorian poetry. She wrote the Christmas carols *In the Bleak Midwinter* and *Love Came Down at Christmas*. Rossetti was a volunteer worker from 1859 to 1870 at the *St Mary Magdalene* house of charity in Highgate.

By the 1880's, recurrent bouts of Graves disease ended Rossetti's attempts to work as a governess. While the illness restricted her social life, she continued to write poems and religious prose works, such as *Seek and Find* (1879), *Called To Be Saints* (1881) and *The Face of the Deep* (1892). In 1891, Rossetti developed cancer, of which she died in London on December 29, 1894.

What are heavy? sea-sand and sorrow. What are brief? today and tomorrow. What are frail? spring blossoms and youth. What are deep? the ocean and truth.


Tread softly! All the earth is holy ground.
